

HazMat Level of Response

All Levels of response will be determined by the on scene Incident Commander

Level 1

Gas, Liquid, or Solid Spill
and No Victims

Incident involving spill or release of Identifiable hazardous material, presenting minimal to moderate risk to public health and the environment, that can be contained and mitigated utilizing equipment and resources readily available to emergency response agencies (Can be handled by one or two departments) and (EMA if over 25 gals. or in the waterway)

Level 2

DART Team Activated
by the On Scene Incident
Commander

Incident involving hazardous materials that can only be identified, tested, sampled, contained, and mitigated utilizing the expertise and resources of a designated hazardous materials incident response team, beyond the scope of emergency first response agencies. significant risk to public health and the environment, requiring Possible evacuations and implementation of protective measure.

This DART response will get an additional containment trailer, 1 entry team, 1 decon team, medical monitoring team, air supply unit, EMA and communications vehicle

Level 3

Full Activation of
The DART Team

Incident involving the release of substantial quantities of hazardous materials, posing significant risk to public health and the environment, requiring major response Involving specialized public and private resources and technical assistance. Incident requires extended response and logistical support operations. Large-scale precautionary Evacuations and establishment of temporary shelter sites may be required.

This DART response will have 2 entry teams, 2 decon teams, medical monitoring team, 3 containment trailers, 2 air supply units, foam, DART trailer, Rehab and Mass Casualty trailers, EMA, Health, communications unit.

(*Level 3 activates the DART ICS Flow Chart with in the ICS Command Structure)
